## What is going on in school?

#### **The Mother Teresa Class**

This half term in our topic 'Rainbows & Raindrops', we are exploring different types of weather and how it affects us. During this lesson, we became familiar with the map of the UK and the countries in it and became weather forecasters. We presented our weather forecast for the UK to our class.



### **The Amelia Earhart Class**

The Amelia Earhart class have been enjoying the last of the summer weather by getting outside for some of their learning in English and Maths. Running around definitely helps children remember word classes and place value! In Science and English, children have been learning about the digestive system. Did you know your small intestine is over 6 metres long? Ask Y3/4 children for other interesting digestive system facts.



#### **The Marcus Rashford Class**

This half term we are learning all about evolution and inheritance; Charles Darwin and his journey on HMS Beagle; and the wonderful diversity of the Galapagos Islands.

The children have been looking at the human and physical geography of the Galapagos islands and had the challenge of mapping out Darwin's route on HMS Beagle and then using a scaled map (and lots of string) to measure how many kilometres he had travelled. Some were very close!



# Y3/4 Ukulele Lessons

This year the Y3/4s will be learning ukulele every Friday through Wider Opps, a Derbyshire initiative set up to help all children learn to play a musical instrument, this is supported by teachers from our local Music Education Hub. They will be coming home with their ukuleles to practice and there will be a performance to showcase their work in the new year.

# Safeguarding at Rowsley CofE Primary

At Rowsley CofE Primary we take safeguarding of the children very seriously. All staff have been trained and our three designated safeguarding leads (DSLs) are Mrs Wyer, Mrs Hodgson and myself; and our safeguarding governor is Rachel Allen-Ashcroft.
