She will be spending time teaching in our partner school, Cemetery School in Kolkata. Miss Lindley will be sharing her experience through live video calls and regular blogs with the children at Rowsley and the children at Cemetery School. If you have any questions about the trip, please do ask her about it (she is understandably very enthusiastic). We recently sent home a sponsorship form and a mileage tracker in paper form, but they can also be found electronically on a Parenthub message sent 17.11.23. The idea is that between the two schools we collectively walk the distance from Rowsley to Kolkata, which is 5000 miles. There is a mileage tracker for you and your child to track the miles you have walked/cycled/scooted. We will be totting up the totals every week. This trip is a federated trip with Stanton in Peak, so she will be travelling with Mr Figg (Y5/6 teacher from Stanton) and several other teachers from Church schools across Derbyshire.

They later went on to label their leaf man in their writing lessons.

Children in Amelia Earhart class have been developing their team-working skills through a number of collaborative group tasks in different lessons, including English and history. They are working hard on listening to each other and giving everyone in the group a chance to contribute. In history lessons, children are really enjoying learning about the Roman Empire. Friday's ukulele lesson is always a highlight of the week, with children continuing to make excellent progress.



#### The Marcus Rashford Class

This half term we have been learning about the world's biomes in Geography and how climate change is affecting our world. This has been linked this to our English lessons, where the children are in the process of writing to our MP (Sarah Dines) to ask what our government plans to do to help combat climate changes. In Science we have been continuing with adaptation, and have looked at how plants have adapted to the grow in the Arctic and Antarctic. In Art we have started gelli printing. Gelli printing is so much fun and the children have produced some amazing pieces which we are looking to develop further before we break up for Christmas.
