The Simone Biles class have done some great map work on seas and oceans this half term and it was a delight to go in and have them name them all for me!

This half term's DT was product design – to design something for a specific purpose. They started out looking at bags and their suitability – Miss Sutton role-played taking a suitcase to a supermarket and then opening the case and all the shopping falling out!! They went on to discuss problems that they encountered on an everyday basis. Here are some of their problems: dropping cutlery on the floor, not being able reach things and teddies falling out of bed. They then went on to design a product to combat their problem and made a prototype. There were some fabulous creations and the children had an awful lot of fun.

School Uniform

School uniform is part of our school identity and continues to be important to the ethos of our school. We hope to get off to a good start in the new academic year.

Daily Uniform

Boys: grey tailored shorts or trousers, royal blue or white polo shirt and royal blue school sweatshirt, black school shoes or sensible black ankle boots (not trainers or equivalent).

Girls: grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or tailored shorts, royal blue or white polo shirt and royal blue school sweatshirt or cardigan, black school shoes or sensible black boots (not trainers or equivalent), blue gingham summer dresses are also acceptable in warm weather.

PE Kit

Navy or black joggers or leggings, white or royal blue t-shirt – no emblems other than the school logo, school jumper or cardigan, trainers.

Football kits or labelled clothing such as Nike tracksuits are not acceptable as a PE kit.

Forest School

Long sleeved top, joggers or leggings, sweatshirt or hoodie – all of a neutral colour. Long sleeves and trousers are essential due to brambles and nettles being in the woods

Your child can come to school in trainers or school shoes for Forest School but must have wellies or walking boots available in a separate bag. They are also expected to bring waterproof trousers

There is always stock on our pre-loved uniform rail, the rail is brought into the playground regularly, alternatively, please pop in when you drop off or pick up to take a look. There is no cost for the items on this rack. A BIG plea from all staff is to PLEASE label your child's clothing – we get so many jumpers left behind as we are unable to identify owners if they are unnamed.

Exciting News

Starting in the new academic year (around October time), Mrs Booker will be running a parent and toddler Forest School session every Thursday. Learning and playing in the outdoors builds confidence, enhances social skills, develops language and communication, motivation and concentration, and also has a positive effect physically and mentally.
