I am not quite sure where to start this half term. We have done so much!

Our topic on The Heart has been fabulous. It started with a 'blood' smoothie where we used food stuffs as the parts of blood – raspberries for red blood cells, marshmallows for white blood cells, apple juice for plasma and sprinkles for the platelets. We then blended it all together to make blood! Then we dissected a heart which was amazing – we were able to identify the 4 chambers, the superior vena cava, the pulmonary valve and the aorta. And finally in DT we started our first woodworking project – a robot! We designed, sawed, stuck, drilled, hammered (loudly) and evaluated.

The Y3/4 children have been learning about rivers in Geography. Children studied Ordnance Survey maps to follow the journeys of the Wye and the Derwent through Derbyshire. They went on a walk around the community to mark on geographical landmarks.

They also carried on with our Poetry Post initiative delivering their wonderful poems to more areas of Rowsley including the local businesses at Peak Village.

Last week they also had a visit from Claire and Mick, who came to talk to the children about the importance of conserving the local environment for the swifts. We are hoping to install some swift boxes at school to encourage these amazing birds to come and nest at school. Did you know that one of the largest swift colonies in Derbyshire is located in Rowsley?

The children were enthralled by the talk. Thank you to Mick and Claire for giving up their time to come in and talk to the children.
