The infant Nativity was truly wonderful – what amazing singing. They had such a lot to learn. We are so lucky to be able to hire the Village Hall for this occasion as having it on stage made all the difference.

This month we took the whole school to the panto in Buxton. This was a fabulous morning out and was enjoyed by all. It was very funny and Mrs Middlebrook secured us the best seats in the house. One of our infants was chosen to go up on stage and help lower a giant spider on to the heads of the ugly sisters!!

Parent Feedback

We recently sent out a parent questionnaire on ParentHub, many thanks to those who completed it.

There were few issues raised which I would like to address.

The look of the playground – it was mentioned that the infant playground had lots of moss on it, which may be slippery. We agree, which is why we have been gaining quotes for a new floor covering and play equipment (similar to the trim trail) for this area. This is a lengthy process but we can now announce that the costings and design were approved by governors at the last full governors meeting at the start of this month. So watch this space!

Our Bronze, Silver and Gold badges – these are displayed on our school website so parents have access to them at all times. The children are able to tell you where they are and what they are working towards, as these are addressed

regularly in class time. If you, as a parent, are unsure and would like more details about how to help your child achieve their next badge, please do come and ask. All staff are happy to talk about this.

The school bell – we certainly can start ringing the school bell again in the morning to mark the start of the day. Please note that school day starts at 9am and the doors are opened from approx. 8.50am in order to allow parents to get to work and stagger the amount of traffic which can build up on the lane.

Community Events – due to Covid community events were restricted in recent years but we are certainly getting back on track with getting out into the community. Below are some of the events which we are doing:

Entering and leaving school through one door – for the safety and safeguarding of our children we will be continuing to let the children out of the doors currently used. The corridors in school are narrow and using just one door would mean over 40 children coming through one corridor all at the same time. We also like to make sure that each child goes home with the correct parent/carer. This is only possible if we continue in the current way so that staff can see them safely into the right hands.

There were lots of lovely positive comments too and we are glad that the children are happy and doing well in our school – this is certainly reflective in their attitudes and behaviour in school.
